. The changed times of the meeting (7.15 - 9.15) were well received, and a lot of positives came from it including more people socialising afterwards. 25 or more came downstairs for a coffee and a chat (twice as many as before).

- . I have run our group for 12 years, with over 1,000 activities in that time, and 12 months ago discussed the thought of some changes with Sophie, as I was getting tired, but we decided that, 'If it ain't broke don't fix it'.
- . Now a year down the track, I have decided to point the Society in a new direction, with the help of some long associated good friends in the Society.
- . I have realised that with the Society is so big now, that I need some help and insight in the direction it takes moving forwards, and I also feel that I have probably become a bit tunnel-visioned, without other photographer's input.
- . Yes, I am a bit of a control-freek, mainly because of how the Society was created, through its association with my business Sutherland Shire Photography.
- . 12 years ago, I spent a year frequenting 5 different camera clubs in and outside the area, looking for motivation to pursue my hobby, but felt overwhelmed and disillusioned that all were composition-based and were too structured and club-orientated (formal), some with quite an impersonal approach, not very social, and few activities. I also felt that they were not very forthcoming with info that would help me understand and extend my photography skills, so I decided to set up my own.
- . As the social gathering of interested photographers became bigger, it became necessary to become more organised in the running of this group, but getting insurances was a big hurdle. See, you needed to be a registered entity to get insurance (amongst other things), and looking into a non-profit organisation, made me realise that with bank accounts (joint signatures), formal committee, tabled minutes, audited yearly accounts etc, etc, it was becoming too hard. It was far, far easier to have the Society associated with 'Sutherland Shire Photography' no problem ...
- . I love the way our Society has developed It's social framework without a competitive base, and it's members outgoing approach to help any who ask, is very precious to me, and makes it a true society 'A group that comes together to share a common interest'.
- . The philosophy of our 'Shire Amateur Photographers' Society' is to foster peoples motivation for photography, in a social, learning environment, without competition, and I hope this never changes.

- . On the 24th August, a provisional steering committee meet with Sophie, Ally & Ralph joining me at Sophie's to discuss how the Society can move forwards. I valued their input and discussion, and am excited as to where this will head the Society in the future. Other meetings are planned, and you will be kept up-to-speed with the outcomes.
- . Hey ... you're not getting rid of me ... This is intended to broaden, and develop the Society in a way to cater to the needs of its members through discussion of ideas and input ...
- . May I add a special note at this time, to thank my brother Warrick, for being ear-bashed for many years, as my sounding-board. Not many people would have a brother as devoted as he is ... Thank you Warrick ...

Outcome from 1st Meeting ...

. Getting back to 'How it Was ...'

Several years back, the Society was about three things – A monthly meeting, a Task to photograph for the month, and an Outing for the month.

It certainly has grown, and has HAD to become part of my business, because of the amount of time it takes to coordinate, organise and build the monthly presentations, newsletters, mystery tours, trips away etc.

The problem has been that except for my photography courses and workshops, the other activities I have been running under the Society banner, and because of this, making a profit was not what it was about.

Unfortunately, because of this, several Mystery Tours, and a couple of Trips Away, actually lost money, because of little or no margin, and when people pulled out at last minute, this created a frustrating situation, of doing a lot of work, then losing money because of it.

- . For this reason the steering committee suggested overwhelmingly that activities should be split between 'Shire Amateur Photographers' Society' and 'Sutherland Shire Photography'.
- . So, starting immediately, you will see two names associated with the Photographic activities of our group.
 - 1. Shire Amateur Photographers' Society (SAPS)
 - 2. Sutherland Shire Photography (SSP)

This basically means that Sutherland Shire Photography will organise (for the Society), Mystery Tours, trips away (domestic & Africa) etc. More later ...
