TASK for February 'Comparing the difference'

To combine with our new segment on Mobile Phones at our monthly meetings at Tradies, the Task for February is one that we set out to compare the differences in taking the subject with your dedicated camera, and then with your phone, and sending me both images to compare. Contrast comparisons are particularly of interest (to see the difference between bright & dark in a scene).

Use the X1 lens on your phone, and for equivalent focal length composition, 18mm on a crop sensor, and 28mm on a full-frame.

Send me up to 5 sets of 2 images – 1 from camera, and 1 from phone. The exif info will tell me which one is which.

Photography has changed for many ...

Photography is changing not only for newcomers to the hobby, but also for the purists like most of us that have grown up moving from black and white to colour film and digital DSLRs to mirrorless.

1. Firstly, is the phone technology producing more and more unbelievable results from such a small package. How do those little lenses capture what we see, so well, and how can the exposure in so many cases have a better outcome than our dedicated cameras. Hey if you want to pixel peep phone images, they still have a long way to go, but they are catching up so fast, that it's only a matter of time, before they will be our preferred option.
2. Secondly, the Ai revolution is advancing so quickly that there is barely time to learn features of programs before they are superseded.

It is for this reason that in the new year with the support of members of the Society, we will have a dedicated section at meetings devoted to learning the opportunities that phones now give us on a day-to-day basis.

It's an approach that I'm sure, will be appreciated by all, and with it comes a renewed motivation for our hobby ...
